About Our Speakers

Bob & Hope Carter

Bob and Hope Carter are medical missionaries who began their career in 1985 serving FUM at Friends Lugulu Hospital in Western Kenya. They returned to the U.S. in 1991 after Bob's mother was diagnosed with cancer. After her death, Bob earned his master's degree in public health at UNC in Chapel Hill and then they returned to Africa in 1997, serving in Zambia with SIM for ten years before returning to Kenya. In Zambia, Bob was a public health consultant for the District Health Office, started the district's first free HIV clinic, and chaired the AIDS Advisory Committee for the Churches Health Association of Zambia (CHAZ). Meanwhile, Hope oversaw the TB and Leprosy services at Mukinge Hospital.

For the last 11 years, they have lived in Kijabe, Kenya and divided their time between Kijabe Hospital and Moffat Bible College. Hope assisted the hospital with its HIV clinic for two years and then focused full-time on teaching in the AIDS Ministries Department at Moffat and serving as the college's health coordinator. Bob taught family medicine residents at the hospital, oversaw its palliative care services for ten years, and led its successful efforts to initiate chemotherapy services for cancer patients, while also serving as director of Moffat's AIDS Ministries Department. Last year the department officially transitioned into the Department of Community Health and Development. Since 2020, Bob has also assisted SIM's International Health Ministries office to design and roll out 'COVID Equip', a program for training pastors, chaplains and Christian community leaders in a gospel-based response to COVID in local communities. As of last year, he is now "retired" from clinical care and focusing more on public health issues and medical education.

Diane Fasion-McKinzie

"The Spirit of Harriet Tubman" is a one-woman play about the leader of the Underground Railroad starring Diane Fasion. Harriet Tubman was an American abolitionist and political activist born into slavery in the early 1820s. She is recognized for her commitment to fighting for equality and justice as displayed through her work on the Underground Railroad. In addition, she was a supporter of women's suffrage and dedicated her life to helping those in need.

Diane Fasion is a retired teacher with a career in education spanning more than 30 years, an actress, visual artist, speaker, and writer. She received her BA degree from North Carolina Central University in Durham, North Carolina. Her graduate studies were at the University of Virginia in Charlottesville, Virginia and Longwood University in Farmville, Virginia. She currently resides in Winston-Salem, North Carolina.
