A Word of Devotion:

FREEDOM
FROM SIN &
DEATH

“Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those
who are in Christ Jesus, because through Christ Jesus
the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you
free from the law of sin and death.”

— Romans 8:1-2

At times in life, we have probably all felt trapped to at least a certain extent. It could have been by our circumstances or even our own actions. Perhaps, we want freedom from a crisis, person, feeling or any other wide variety of things that weigh us down or make our lives difficult. When we find ourselves in these situations, we may long for freedom but struggle to find it. No matter our struggle, there is one who offers freedom that we could never find on our own with our own power. Jesus Christ gives freedom from sin and death. For us, this kind of freedom is incomprehensible and unattainable, but Jesus offers it to us when we believe in salvation through him.

Sin is a struggle, and no matter where we are in our Christian walks, we will always encounter temptations. However, when we have accepted Christ into our lives, we are set free from the bondage of sin. We are no longer controlled by our own desires and nature but rather are submitting to God's will for us.

True freedom does not have to do with being able to do our own thing, but rather we find true freedom when we submit to Christ and his righteousness. God's will is much better than ours could ever be (Isaiah 55:8-9).

Romans 6:18 says, "You have been set free from sin and have become slaves to righteousness." We have a higher purpose than our own desire to make choices or escape our struggles. We are called to live for Jesus and in righteousness.

Even though we have freedom in Jesus, we shouldn't go around making bad decisions or choosing sin as Christ is now the master of our lives. Galatians 5:13 tells us to use our freedom to serve one another. We may have the option and opportunity to sin but that doesn't mean we should take that route.

To compare with a simpler example, when we are little children, we have our parent/guardians to tell us what to do. They tell us to eat food, get adequate sleep, etc. After time has passed, we have to make those decisions for ourselves. Just because we have that freedom to choose not to take care of ourselves, doesn't mean that we shouldn't. It is the same way with our freedom from sin, we should do what we know is right even though it's in our power to choose what's wrong.

The Cost of Our Freedom

Although the name might imply otherwise, freedom comes at a cost. Before Christ, we are so stuck in our sins and we could never get out and are doomed to death. Jesus, however, was willing to take on our debts. He took on the consequences of our sin, a horrible death, even though he had never sinned and done nothing to deserve that sentence.

God loves us so much and so deeply that He created a plan that included sending His own son to earth knowing he would need to face suffering and death. This is the price of our freedom.

Thanks be to God for paying the price of our freedom from sin. This is something worth celebrating. We can now have victory and true freedom over sin and death. This leaves us with the decision to choose to embrace this freedom God has blessed us with and pursue righteousness or let our sin continue to control us. Praise God that we no longer must be slaves to sin.

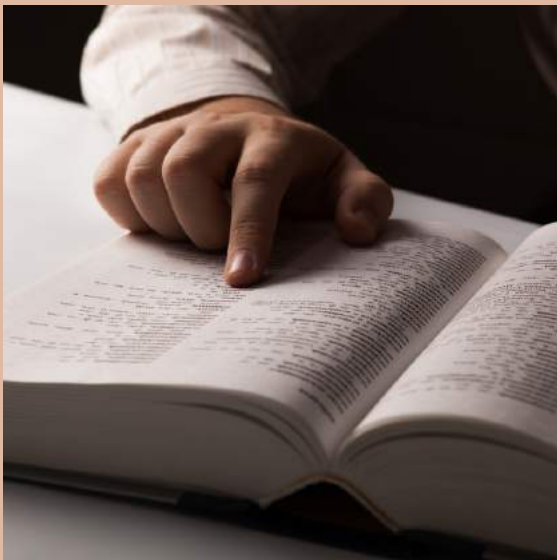

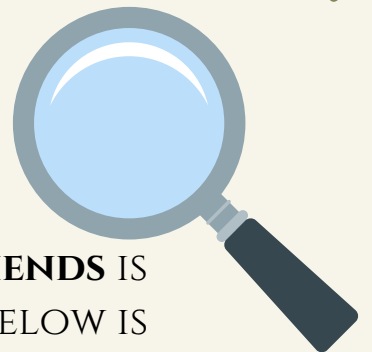

- Overall objective is to seek to lead lost souls to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ
- Responsible for all Sunday morning services
- Prayerfully seek to bring Biblical and practical messages to the congregation each week
- Sensitive, during Open Worship, to the Holy Spirit's leading so that there may be opportunity for free expression of the Lord's message through the congregation's voice
- Encouraged to be present at church functions and outings, outside of the Sunday morning worship hour, to build and strengthen relationships with members of the congregation

- Participate in visitation of shut-ins, hospital, nursing homes, and other crisis situations while helping to develop ministries that will provide care to a growing church family in times of need

Compensation package will be commensurate with the individual's education and experience. Bi-vocational and part-time position applicants are also encouraged to apply.



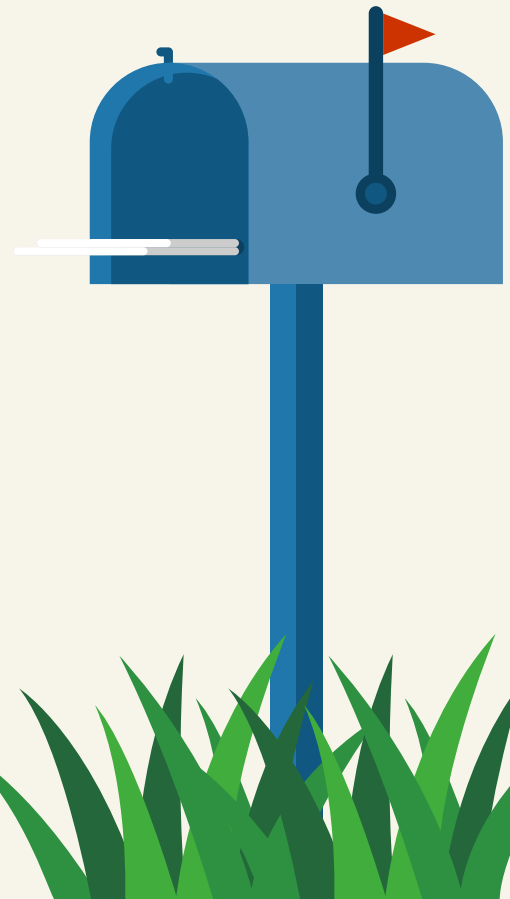

Construction begins on the new biogas generator for Friends Theological College.

A beehive of activities has been happening at Friends Theological College this week. A major project, a modern biogas digester—one of its kind in Western Kenya—is being constructed at FTC. A biogas digester is capable of producing gaseous renewable energy from raw materials such as agricultural waste, manure, plant material, and food waste. When the digester is completed, it will save the Kaimosi natural forest from being destroyed for institutional cooking activities. FTC trains church leaders who are concerned not only with spiritual matters, but who are also concerned with the global environment.

3.

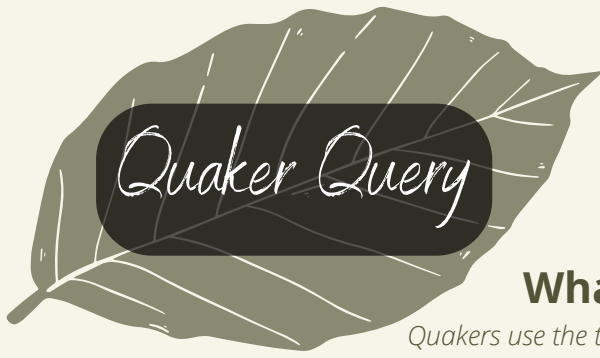
People need comfort, assurance, encouragement and exhortation. Do elders have a special responsibility here?

In 1869, a 15-year old Palestinian girl named Miriam Karam mustered up the courage to ask two Quaker visitors to Ramallah, Eli and Sybil Jones, to start a girl's school in the area. At that time, no education program existed for women in this region. Before long, a medical mission and boarding school for girls was in place. By 1902, a similar boarding school for boys was created by Friends.

It is doubtful that Miriam, Sybil, or Eli could ever have imagined what Ramallah Friends School (RFS) would look like in the 21st century. As the only accredited International Baccalaureate (IB) World School in Palestine, RFS offers an innovative and multi-disciplinary education that prepares Palestinian young people to be outstanding scholars, leaders, and change-makers in their community and around the world. Nurtured in an academic and community life guided by Christian Quaker values and spirituality, the School aims to impact both Christian and Muslim students in a wholistic and life-changing way.
