It is a critical time for students to be working on their applications for the Eliza Armstrong Cox Scholarship. Applications for 2024-2025, are to be <u>postmarked no later than March 15, 2024</u>. The applications should be mailed to Bennie Burton, 155 Toms Creek Bluff Ln, Pilot Mountain, NC 27041. All application forms are found on the website, www: <u>friendschurchnc.org/usfw</u>. The forms can be folded and sent by regular mail. For new applicants, the application is two pages, a personal written information letter, and a third page for the applicant to hand their 3 references. Students reapplying only need the one-page application form and a copy of his/her college transcript. All candidates must be a participating member of a meeting that actively participates in NCUSFW.

There are GUIDELINES FOR ELIZA ARMSTRONG COX SCHOLARSHIP FUND on the next page.

GUIDELINES FOR ELIZA ARMSTRONG COX SCHOLARSHIP FUND

- 1. The amount of the grant will be determined by funds available.
- 2. The candidate shall be a participating member of a meeting that actively participates in NCUSFW.
- 3. The candidate shall have successfully completed secondary education requirements and shall have been accepted by a college.
- 4. <u>First time</u> applicants must submit the two-page application, 3 reference forms and a personal letter.
- 5. To be considered for a grant for the succeeding academic year, recipients must submit updated information on the returning applicant form plus a transcript from the college.
- 6. Scholarships shall only be awarded for a maximum of four (4) years.
- 7. Funds must be requested from NC USFW Treasurer by December 31 of the academic year applied.
- 8. Applications for new and returning students must be postmarked on or before March 15, and are on the website, www:friendschurchnc.org/usfw.

ADULT MISSIONARY EDUCATION



If you read the FUM newsletter, you already know the happy news from Cuba Yearly Meeting. A new Worship Group has started meeting in Santiago de Cuba, under the care of Cuba Yearly Meeting. Yerandi Ricardo Reyes and wife Zucel Caminero Pérez moved to Zucel's relatives house in Santiago de Cuba to begin the work, and at the same time, to secure the property since houses cannot be empty or occupied by people who are not relatives for long before they pass to the hands of the government.

In my communications with Yerandi, I learned that they began the work on March 25, 2023 and they meet on Wednesdays and Saturdays at night with adults, and on Sunday mornings they meet with the children. On Wednesdays the adults participate in Bible studies and prayer meetings. On Saturday nights they listen to the messages brought to them by Yerardi. The average is eight





adults.

The children's program consists of Bible stories, games, songs, sports and art work. He also says that they find a way to provide refreshments for them. He also says that the parents and the community appreciate the work they are doing with the children very much. At the present time, the average number of children that attend Sunday School is 15. He happily reports that more children are beginning to come for which he is thankful. At the beginning, they found resistance from the parents, but now they realize how happy they are with the programs, and they want their children to participate.

I asked Zucel, Yerandi's wife, if she had plans to organize a USFW group, and she wrote that at the present time there is not a Women Society. She regularly meets with the women to pray for them, their children and families. They also visit the sick and when financial help is available, they help those in need.

In my contact with these Friends, I sense their joy and commitment to this mission work in a small and poor neighborhood in the outskirts of the city.

Both Zucel and Yerandi have connected with other churches in the community and often participate in programs and workshops, which help them gain more knowledge in theology and church history. In one of the gatherings under the theme "Fellowship with God and Others," they felt the fellowship, love and support of many brothers and sisters in Christ. This expression of love and support encourages them to continue their ministry.

These Friends need our spiritual support and they work hard under difficult circumstances to continue the work that Quakers began in Cuba in 1900. It is interesting to note that Yerandi is originally from Gibara. It was in this port of sea that the first missionaries began the work of Quakers in Cuba.

Let's continue to pray for these Friends and for all of those involved and participating in this endeavor.



Elizabeth Mulimi is the Christian Service Secretary for USFWI and she lives in Kenya, Africa. I will be using excerpts from her article.

"The sole purpose of the existence of any human life, no matter the social status, is based on service that begets an impact on the lives of others."..."The title of this article draws inspiration from the acknowledged words by Pope Francis when he said, "Rivers do not drink their own water; trees do not eat their own fruit; the sun does not shine on itself and flowers do not spread their fragrance for themselves. Living for others is a rule of nature. We are all born to help each other. No matter how difficult it is....Life is good when you are happy; but much better when others are happy because of you."

The harmony in our world we call Mother Nature shows how elements of nature blend together to serve one another and all of human kind. 
