**SCHOLARSHIP**

It is a critical time for students to be working on their applications for the Eliza Armstrong Cox Scholarship. Application forms for 2026-2027 are to be postmarked no later than March 15, 2026. **The applications should be mailed to Bennie Burton, 155 Toms Creek Bluff Lane, Pilot Mountain, NC 27041**

All application forms are found on the website, [www: friendschurchnc.org/usfw](http://www.friendschurchnc.org/usfw). The forms can be folded and sent by regular mail. For new applicants, the application is two pages, a personal written information letter, and a third page for the applicant to hand to their 3 references. Students reapplying only need the one-page application form and a copy of his/her college transcript. All candidates must be a participating member of a meeting that actively participates in NCUSFW.

**GUIDELINES FOR ELIZA ARMSTRONG COX SCHOLARSHIP FUND**

The amount of the grant will be determined by funds available.

The candidate shall be a participating member of a meeting that actively participates in NCUSFW.

The candidate shall have successfully completed secondary education requirements and shall have been accepted by a college.

First time applicants must submit the two-page application, 3 reference forms and a personal letter.

To be considered for the grant for the succeeding academic year, recipients must submit updated information on the returning applicant form and a transcript from the college.

Scholarships shall only be awarded for a maximum of four (4) years.

Funds must be requested from USFW NC treasurer by December 31 of the academic year applied.

Applications for new and returning students must be postmarked on or before March 15, and are on the website, [www:friendschurchnc.org/usfw](http://www.friendschurchnc.org/usfw) .

We cannot neglect to feed the coffers that fund the Eliza Armstrong Cox Scholarship Fund. Please do so by the end of March 2026. The amount of funds at the end of March determines the amount of money each of our approved applicants receive. The Eliza Armstrong Cox Lifetime Fellowship membership is an honor and recognition for service and dedication to the meeting and NC USFW. Circles submit \$25 per nomination, (\$12.50 goes to USFWI and \$12.50 goes to the Cox Scholarship fund). A certificate, signed by the USFWI President as well as the NC USFW President, is sent to the Circle that submits the name(s) for recognition. Nominations can be made at any time of the year, but members are recognized at the Annual Gathering in the fall each year. Enclose \$25.00 per nominee payable to NC USFW and send the form to the NC USFW Treasurer with your check.

“Every faculty you have, your power of thinking or of moving your limbs from moment to moment, is given you by God. If you devoted every moment of your whole life exclusively to His service, you could not give Him anything that was not in a sense His own already.” C.S. Lewis

**ADULT MISSIONARY EDUCATION***Sandy Ward*

Our Circle at Centre Friends have supported Siloam for many years with our prayers and donations. The following is from an article written by Joyce George about her 33 years at Siloam Missionary homes in Snow Camp, North Carolina.

She begins her story with celebrating her 70th birthday a couple of months ago. Thirty-three of those years were invested in the ministry at Siloam – to provide a place for missionaries to call home. Her journey in missions began for her even before she was born her mom and dad went to the mission field of Brazil in 1951 working with tribal people who desperately needed to hear the message of the Gospel. During her middle and high school years she attended Puraquequara, boarding school for missionary kids, but summers were spent with her parents, working with the Pacas Novas Indians. She grew up swimming in the Amazon, fighting snakes on her way to the “outhouse” playing basketball and soccer, teaching tribal people how to read and learning what it meant to be a missionary. She remembered hearing one of the natives wailing when one of their own passed away and the sweet sound of the voices lifted in song during Sunday services that were held in the slat sided hut that served as a church. What a blessing and privilege to have grown up that way. She had no idea what God had in store for the rest of her life. But in His faithfulness. He was preparing her for the journey ahead.

As she grew into adulthood, she thought that she would return to the mission field in Brazil, but little did she know that God had another plan for her. Before God led them to start Siloam, she always felt an emptiness in her heart especially when missionaries would come and speak in her church. Her heart was bent toward missions and many times she questioned the Lord, asking if I’m not to spend my life as a missionary, why did she have a restlessness in her heart that just didn’t go away? The answer to the question came when he laid it on their hearts to start Siloam Missionary homes. Her experience as a missionary kid gave her the understanding of what they go through when returning to the US for furlough and she was thankful the


restlessness went away when she and her husband stepped into God's will for their lives. Over the last few months a new restlessness has begun to fill her heart and God is leading her to a different chapter in her life. As she read God's word and spent time in prayer, He has shown her that her time at Siloam is complete. She said that she never thought -not in a million years she would say those words. She is sure that you have experienced something similar when you were completely content in how your life was going, but then God started revealing a new plan for you. That is where she finds herself right now and where she wants to be.

A few weeks ago, her daily prayer was, "Lord I believe my time here is finished, but I know that you are not finished with me. You have promised in your Word to give me a heart's desire if I ask, and so I am asking you to put a desire in me." Her daughter, Abbey, recently went on a mission trip with her church. After a conversation with her about her trip, a desire began to spring up in Joyce. There is a great need among missionaries that we don't necessarily see when they visit in our churches. That is the need for encouragement, a listening ear a friend who understands the challenges that they face and someone to walk with them for a while. She believes that God is putting this on her heart and that he wants her to be that person for some of them. She doesn't have a firm answer on where God is leading her or how this will take form, but she is seeking his will for the next years of her life. She is trusting in his perfect plan for her and knows that missions is still where God wants her to be. PLEASE PRAY THAT HE WILL FINISH THAT PERFECT PLAN THAT HE HAS FOR HER She says he is not done with me yet and wherever he wants her is where she wants to be. Please keep Joyce in your prayers and Siloam Missionary homes in your thoughts and prayers. They love volunteers & donations as they support missionaries on furlough or waiting on God's plan for the rest of their lives. Thank you for all who give of their time, their resources, their skills to help make Siloam a place where missionaries are refreshed , renewed, and blessed.
