PASTOR JOB DESCRIPTION

PRIMARY FUNCTION:

- The Pastor's major concern should be for the spiritual well-being and growth of the whole church and prospective members.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ, having accepted Him as Savior and Lord
- Have an understanding and agreement with FCNC Friends Faith and Practice
- Good communication and organizational skills
- Previous training and/or experience as a pastor in a church setting is preferred

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Overall objective is to seek to lead lost souls to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ
- Responsible for all Sunday morning services
- Prayerfully seek to bring Biblical and practical messages to the congregation each week
- Sensitive, during Open Worship, to the Holy Spirit's leading so that there may be opportunity for free expression of the Lord's message through the congregation's voice
- Encouraged to be present at church functions and outings, outside of the Sunday morning worship hour, to build and strengthen relationships with members of the congregation
- Available and willing to perform wedding and funeral services
- Participate in visitation of shut-ins, hospital, nursing homes, and other crisis situations while helping to develop ministries that will provide care to a growing church family in times of need
- Provide spiritual direction through listening, prayer, and counsel to members who desire to give attention to their spiritual and personal lives
- Must maintain confidentiality of members as they share personal burdens and concerns
- Support and build up present leadership in the church through prayer and encouragement while mentoring other potential leaders
- Be available by phone for contact and ministry needs, while set office hours are not required
- Encouraged to take part in a variety of activities on the Quarterly Meeting and FCNC levels as well as in the wider body of Friends United Meeting

ACCOUNTABILITY:

- Prepare and present a monthly Ministry Activity Report to Ministry and Counsel
- Pastor will be subject to the oversight of Ministry and Counsel, to include regular and timely performance evaluations

Compensation package will be commensurate with the individual's education and experience. Bi-vocational and part-time position applicants are also encouraged to apply.



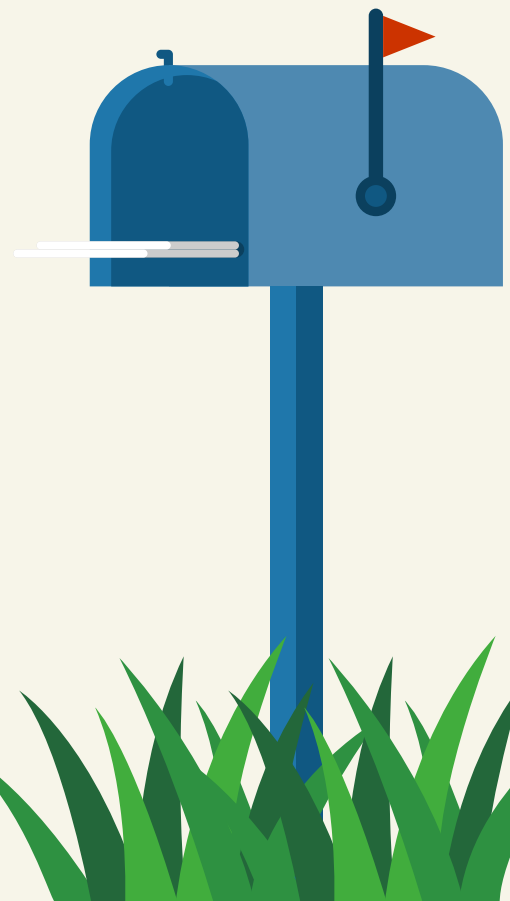

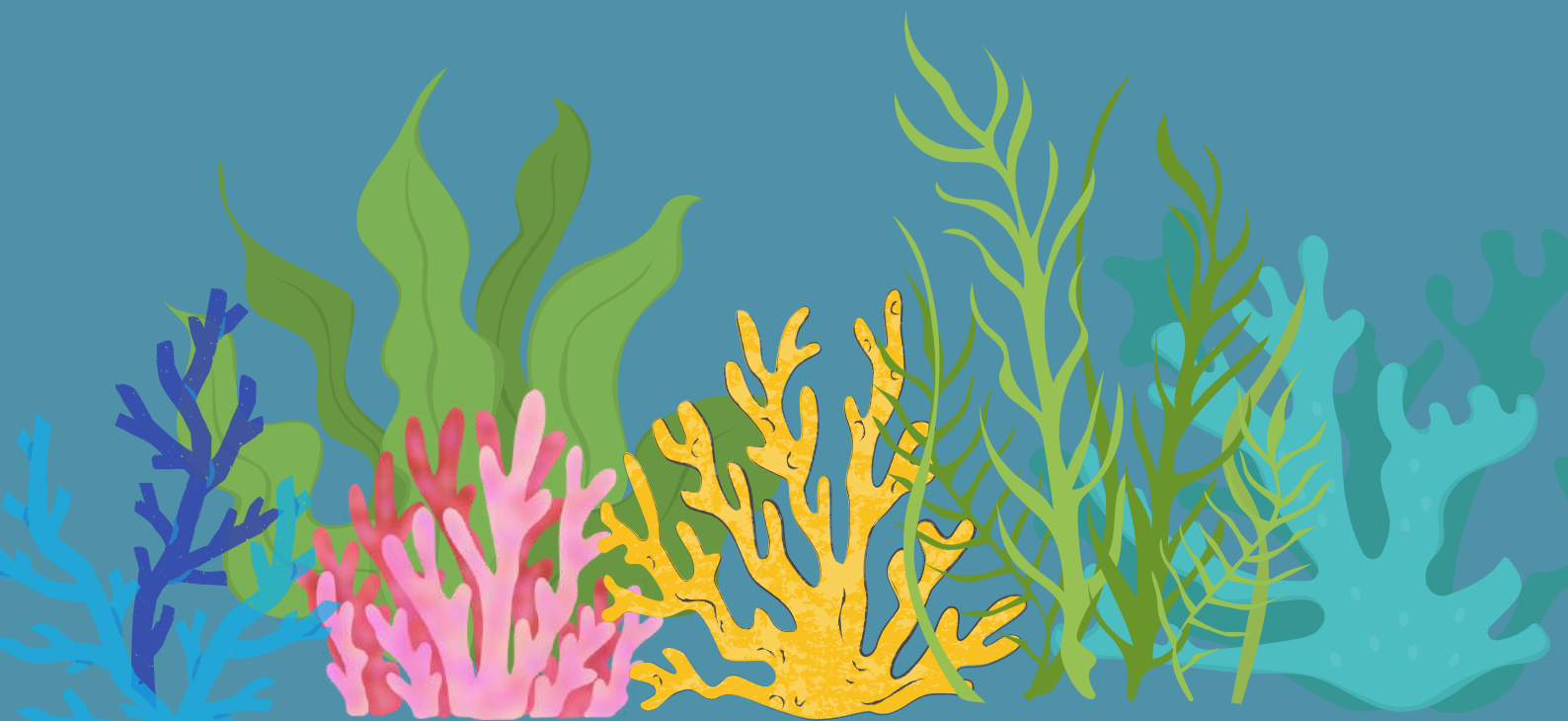

Record-Breaking Flooding in Kenya

Recent floods have wreaked havoc in Kenya, causing death, destruction of homes, bursting bridges, and rendering main highways impassable.

In addition, more than 200 people have died, thousands have been displaced, and nearly 2,000 schools have been destroyed. All remaining schools have been shut down until further notice, while the schools on higher water table lands have become homes for internally displaced families. Flooding has especially affected the area around the town of Mai Mahui, in Nakuru County, where it has claimed the lives of at least fifty-two people, eighteen of whom were children. In Turkana, the main highway that connects Kitale and Lodwar was washed away amid the heavy rains.

Some basic Quaker Freedoms:

Freedom to think:

Friends are free to think for themselves, in honesty and sincerity. This freedom is likely to be taken for granted, and therefore not fully appreciated.

Freedom to interpret Scripture:

Friends have no hierarchy or Authority figures who make pronouncements as to what individuals may believe. Each individual with his Bible and with the enlightenment of the Holy Spirit may seek for truth and light as it may be revealed to him.

Freedom to make moral decisions:

Friends respect the dignity of the individual before God, and the dignity of his conscience. Since no one is infallible, group wisdom and group guidance may be needed. Individuals have the responsibility of helping one another.

Individual Responsibility

One cannot rightly talk about freedom apart from responsibility.

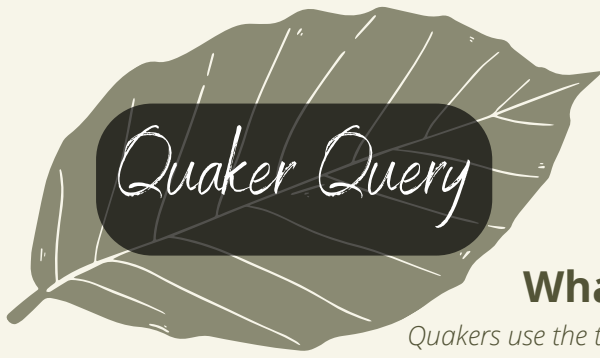

Meet our Missions

Samburu Friends Mission



The Samburu people are nomadic pastoralists who keep cattle, sheep, goats, camels, and donkeys. Recently, huge swaths of collectively-held range land in the Samburu region have been privatized, leading to extreme disruption of grazing and migration patterns. This, in turn, has led to an increase in violent conflict with neighboring communities. Education and literacy training for the Samburu are crucial at this time, as capable leadership is needed in negotiating these conflicts, and only 6% of Samburu adults have a secondary school education.

Building the Friends Church in Samburu involves building communities, not building buildings. As early Friends knew, it is the body of Christ that matters, not the building in which Christ is housed. Worship is often shared under a tree with indigenous songs, spirited dancing, and readings from the Bible.
