LOOKING TO GOD THROUGH A SEASON OF CHANGE

'For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven'
-Ecclesiastes 3:1

The summer's heat begins to slowly fade. Cold beverages are replaced with warm pumpkin spice lattes and sweet apple cider. Tank tops and shorts are traded in for jackets and jeans. Thick green leaves now dress themselves in vibrant hues preparing for their graceful descent, and as the days grow shorter and a gentle crispness fills the air, we find ourselves once again in the embrace of autumn, the season of change. The change in season may also mean a change in the pace of life as well. You might be eating breakfast on the run, rushing your kids to the bus stop, sitting in long carpool lines, or packing up your college student for the start of the school year. And just as you're catching your breath, your mind can easily wander to the family holidays that are lurking around the corner. The act of letting go is a powerful way to experience God's freedom to move forward with a lighter heart.

3. Embrace Change

Isaiah 43:19 says, "For I am about to do something new." Autumn vividly demonstrates to us that change is not just inevitable, but also beautiful. Perhaps God has allowed changes in your life that you don't yet understand, but be assured that He will navigate you through all the adjustments. Or maybe the question to ask in this season is, "What change is God calling me to make in my life?" Do you need to spend more time in prayer or reading through Scripture? Perhaps you need to change your schedule and build in more time for loved ones or friends. The beauty of autumn lies not only in its breathtaking landscapes but also in its subtle reminder that change is an ongoing part of God's design.

In the grand symphony of the seasons, autumn stands out as a great teacher of God's lessons for life and change. As we explore this season of change, let's learn from the wisdom it offers. We can learn to slow down, let go, and embrace change. So as you step outside and feel the crispness in the air, remember the profound lessons this season brings and carry them throughout your life story.








HUNTER CARR COLE

DEEP CREEK FRIENDS MEETING YOUTH MINISTER JOB DESCRIPTION

Overview

This is a part-time (15-20 hours per week) youth minister position. The youth minister reports to the Christian Education Committee. The youth minister is responsible for providing spiritual leadership, mentorship, and support to the middle school and high school youth of Deep Creek Friends Meeting. This position will involve fostering a welcoming environment for young people to grow in their Christian faith and to become committed followers of Jesus Christ who participate in worship, fellowship, and discipleship.

The youth minister will receive 20 hours of vacation time/personal time per year (equivalent to one week per year), which is nontransferable from year to year.  - Attend church-wide business meetings (one per month)
 - Communicate regularly with the congregation about youth meetings, activities, events, and projects
 - Support other church activities and events 0



Reflections from Jamaica Yearly Meeting




Earlier this month I traveled to Highgate, Jamaica, to participate in the annual sessions of Jamaica Yearly Meeting. From the beginning, I was blessed by the warmth, hospitality, and gracious welcome extended by Friends.

The opening sessions brought Friends from across the island together in worship and fellowship. It was encouraging to witness the faithfulness of local Meetings as they entered into the business and worship of the body.

On the second day, the Yearly Meeting received reports from Friends institutions, committees, and local Meetings. Each Monthly Meeting gave a careful accounting of its life and struggles, and the larger body listened with attentiveness and compassion. The reports made clear that there are deep challenges facing Jamaica Yearly Meeting—concerns about sustainability, leadership, and resources. Yet, even in the midst of these difficulties, Friends showed a willingness to stand with one another, seeking ways to be faithful in the face of hardship.




