

A Word of Devotion

EXPERIENCING GOD

It's important to have a robust intellectual faith, one that can withstand all kinds of attacks and challenges. But it's also essential that we have a robust experiential faith, one that understands what it means to have a personal relationship with God.

After all, didn't Jesus say that eternal life consists of knowing Him and His Father (not merely knowing about Him; see John 17:3). Didn't Paul write that we enjoy fellowship with the Spirit (2 Corinthians 13:14)? Didn't Peter speak of the inexpressible and glorious joy that is a direct result of our faith (see 1 Peter 1:8)? And isn't salvation (and the new birth) something that we experience?

That's ultimately how we know that the Bible is truly God's Word, not simply by intellectual arguments but by experiencing the God of the Bible in our own lives.

That's ultimately how we know that Jesus rose from the dead, not simply by apologetic proofs but by encountering the risen Savior for ourselves.

In John 4, the Samaritan woman did a great job of evangelizing her neighbors, telling them about her amazing encounter with Jesus. But after they met Jesus for themselves they said, "It is no longer because of what you said that we believe, for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is indeed the Savior of the world" (John 4:42).

Nothing compares to a personal encounter with the Lord. And nothing can be substituted for it.

As Leonard Ravenhill, author of the classic book Why Revival Tarries, often said, "A man with an experience is never at the mercy of a man with an argument." Recently, I was interacting with two former evangelical Christians, neither of whom believe the gospel today and one of whom is an aggressive atheist. I asked each of them (separately and independently) if they ever witnessed an undeniable miracle (including a miraculous, distinct answer to prayer) back in their Christian days. If so, how would they explain that miracle today? Not surprisingly, neither one said that they had ever witnessed a miracle, with the atheist even dismissing the possibility of such a thing.

Of course, as followers of Jesus, we experience suffering and hardship like everyone else, and many of our prayers are not answered. And we don't witness outstanding miracles 24/7, as if God were our cosmic genie available at our beck and call.

But surely we should be able to point to some indisputable divine activity in our lives, be it in supernatural, personal transformation or in answers to prayer or in divine leading or in the manifestation of a spiritual gift. And surely our friendship with God should be real and deep enough to be able to withstand both the vicissitudes of life and the challenges of our modern world.

In these days in which we live, days of unique spiritual and moral and cultural and intellectual challenges to our faith, knowing about God and affirming that the Bible is true is not enough.

He is a God to be Experienced in Relationship.

Instead, we must know Him personally and intimately, telling both skeptic and seeker, "I know the Bible is true because I have experienced its reality in my own life."

It might sound trite to say, "I know He lives because He lives within my heart." But that saying remains true and real to this day.

He is God to be experienced, and He invites us to enjoy fellowship with Him, not just corporately but individually.



Earlier this year, we made two building trips to New Bern. In each of these trips, we saw there is still a need for volunteers to help with families dealing with homes damaged by multiple hurricanes. There are many families with no insurance or funds to repair their homes. These families are depending on volunteers to help them get their homes repaired. We committed to make another trip to New Bern in September to help additional families with desperately needed home repairs.

We will continue to work with the Baptists On Missions Disaster Group as we did in the spring. We will be staying at their New Bern Rebuild Center and they will be providing us with all our meals. Belize Tutoring Program

When Covid-19 began, Belize Friends School closed to in-person classes as required by law. The Belize ministries shifted their immediate attention to a food program, realizing that a sharp increase in unemployment would lead to food insecurity for many. Director Nikki Holland found donor support for iPads so students continue studying virtually. Months later, it became possible to open the center for one-on -one tutoring, though not for in-person classes. The teens who came for help included Belize Friends School alumni as well as students. They asked for help and encouragement, especially when they doubted their inability to continue their schooling through pandemic circumstances. All of the children who asked for help have continued their education. Nikki describes the students as "brilliant, resilient, determined, and absolutely admirable."

2022

As many of you may know, Bob and Hope Carter are a couple that we have been supporting for many years. Their work for Jesus has been a joy to follow! They put out a seasonal newsletter called "The Carter Chronicles". We have included some of their spring issue below, as well as ways to PRAY for them and financially SUPPORT their Ministry.

Dear Friends and Ministry Partners,

Kenyan believers are a prayerful people, even more so than many Western Christians. When they hold prayer meetings, they last not just an hour but often all night. Meetings begin and end with prayer. Travel begins and ends with prayer. Visitors often enter a house invoking a blessing from God and when they depart their hosts pray over them as they leave. Kenyans have much to pray about: the drought, families still struggling in an economy not yet recovered from the impacts of COVID restrictions, rising numbers of deaths and disability from cancer, strokes, heart disease, infec- tious diseases, and road accidents. Anxieties are shared about the upcom- ing general elections in August, which are expected to be highly contentious and will again pit two powerful political dynasties against each other.

But since Russia's invasion of Ukraine, prayer meetings and congrega- tional prayers have often focused on intercessions for Ukraine. Daily news updates on the Russian invasion and the heroic and sacrificial resistance of the Ukrainian people overshadow virtually all other topics. Kenyans are once again praying for peace, but this time it is not for themselves but for a (Col. 4:3)

sister democracy under threat from invasion and oppression. Kenyans pray because they still remember from their own history what it felt like to be under the dominion of an occupying power. We pray, too.

We did return to Kenya as scheduled in early January and kept quite busy through the completion of Term 2 at Moffat Bible College. We were able to finalize and submit course grades just before leaving for Greece on 2nd April to attend an international medical conference, where Bob had been asked to present two lectures. From Greece we returned to Indianapolis, which will be home base for us until our return to Kenya in September. (Yes, our heads are spinning!)

From now through August, we will stay engaged in remote teaching at Moffat Bible College while also traveling and reporting back to our ministry partners. Please contact us if you would like us to speak to your church or small group, or even to just get together over a nice cup of

tea or coffee.


Quaker Lake Summer Camp 2022
