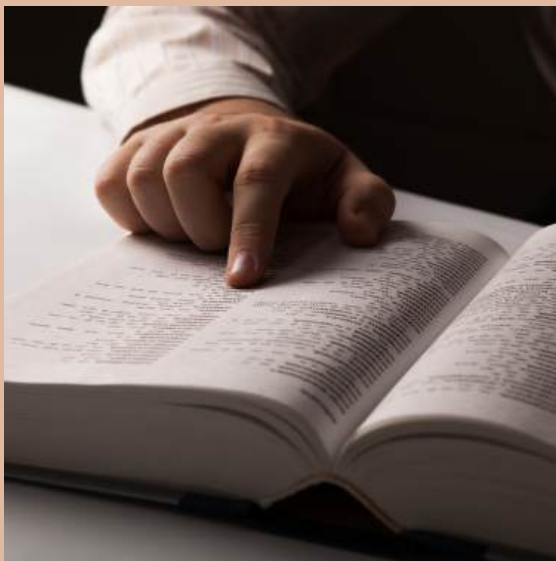

Applicants will receive an email indicating receipt of their application materials. Once materials have been reviewed, applicants should expect an email if they are eligible for an interview(s).

Compensation and Benefits

This is a salaried position. The salary range is \$50,000 to \$58,000. Salary will be determined commensurate with the applicant's qualifications. The pastor will be provided a 6% IRA contribution. Housing is available for the pastor near the meeting. The pastor will receive two weeks of paid vacation per year, which is nontransferable from year to year. The pastor will have opportunities each year to attend Christian conferences/retreats, which are to be paid for by Deep Creek Friends Meeting in accordance with the approved annual budget.

- Possess a personal relationship with Jesus Christ, having accepted Him as Lord and Savior
- A call to the pastorate and the desire for personal growth and development in that calling

**DEEP CREEK FRIENDS MEETING**  
**YOUTH MINISTER JOB DESCRIPTION**

Overview

This is a part-time (15–20 hours per week) youth minister position. The youth minister reports to the Christian Education Committee. The youth minister is responsible for providing spiritual leadership, mentorship, and support to the middle school and high school youth of Deep Creek Friends Meeting. This position will involve fostering a welcoming environment for young people to grow in their Christian faith and to become committed followers of Jesus Christ who participate in worship, fellowship, and discipleship.

Application Instructions

To apply for the position of a part-time youth minister at Deep Creek Friends Meeting, submit the following:

- 1) A current resume that includes your qualifications and work history;
- 2) A list of three non-family references to speak to your character and work performance;
- 3) A typed statement detailing:
  - a. Your relationship with Jesus Christ;
  - b. Your desire to be a youth minister; *and*
  - c. Any other information you deem relevant and want to share; *and*
- 4) One typed lesson plan for a youth meeting one hour in length.

Once materials have been reviewed, you should expect an email response indicating receipt of your materials. If eligible for an interview(s), you should expect a phone call. Appropriate steps will then be taken to schedule a time and place for the interview(s).

Compensation and Benefits

This is a salaried position. Salary will be determined commensurate with education and experience. The youth minister will receive 20 hours of vacation time/personal time per year (equivalent to one week per year), which is nontransferable from year to year. Additionally, the youth minister will have off any days the church is closed for approved holidays or inclement weather. The youth minister will have opportunities each year to attend Christian conferences/retreats which are to be paid for by Deep Creek Friends Meeting in accordance with the approved annual budget.

- An active and growing relationship with Jesus Christ
- The ability to articulate clearly the Christian faith

- A call to youth ministry
- The ability to establish and maintain an effective working relationship with other staff and the Christian Education Committee
- A high school diploma or equivalent
- Experience working with youth and children
- 21 years of age
- Must have a valid driver's license in the state of North Carolina
- Must pass a background check

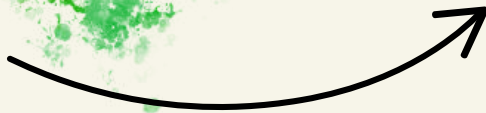

  - Lead and coordinate weekly youth meetings for two age groups:
    - Third through sixth grade
    - Seventh through twelfth grade
  - Develop Bible-based lessons and activities that nurture spiritual growth
  - Provide mentorship to youth members
  - Provide support for youth members and their families
  - Encourage youth participation in church services, ministries, and outreach
  - Plan and execute a Christmas program each year involving the youth
  - Plan and execute one youth outing per quarter
  - Plan and execute one youth service project per quarter
  - Attend Christian Education Committee meetings (one per month)
  - Timely submit articles and relevant activities for publication in the church newsletter
  - Contribute to the growth of the youth ministry by maintaining relationship with current youth members and building connection with prospective youth members

## Matamoros Update – Christmas 2025

One of the ongoing Missions that Friends Church of North Carolina supports is a Friends church on the outskirts of Matamoros, Mexico. Many of you have visited and know first-hand the great work that is occurring there. The pastor at Matamoros, Hilda Martinez, along with her husband, Fernando, do great work in the area and are always coming up with new ways to serve the community.

Along with regular services on Sunday mornings and Wednesday nights, Hilda and Fernando provide Sunday School and Bible Studies at the Church. Every Saturday they have a regular radio program they use for evangelism. Saturdays are also spent going downtown Matamoros to minister from the streets. Each year they have a vacation bible school that all of the children look forward to. The city has recently let them use a large open municipal building to use for vacation bible school and other activities, bring Christ to many kids for the first time. They also make regular trips to Isla Fantasia, a very impoverished fishing village about an hour south of the church. Members of the Church collect clothing and food items to give to the people on the island. They do not have electricity on the island and can only be reached by boat. Hilda is constantly baking and cooking items that she sales at events and online. They are always looking for new ways to raise money for their outreach.

Wherever Hilda and Fernando go, they always bring big smiles and love to everyone they encounter. Their spirit of giving and service is truly admirable and a joy to be around. They introduce many people to Christ not only with words and sermons but also with their love, caring and generosity. If you ever get the chance to visit Matamoros, you will be blessed.

Each year, FCNC provides the mission with \$500 prior to Christmas to help bring Christmas to the children in the area. Below is a letter from Hilda and Fernando expressing their gratitude. I have used google translate to translate the letter so those of you fluent in Spanish may find errors. Hilda sent me lots of photos capturing many of their different activities. Some of those are attached.

To Whom It May Concern

Dear brothers and sisters of the Friends in the USA board, we send our greetings and love.

From Matamoros, Tamaulipas. Wishing that God's blessing and grace may always be upon your lives.

This year we were so blessed by your offerings and donations that the best way to thank and appreciate what you do for us is by working in the Kingdom of God in our assigned place.

The reason for this letter is to tell you how we used the Christmas offering.

We are also deeply grateful for this offering, because thanks to it, not only our church was blessed, but also many other people in our community.

1. We held an evangelistic program, "A Drama," in a public space that was lent to us by the municipal government. More than 100 children attended, not counting the adults. We bought cylinders and filled them with candy, as well as piñatas and toys for the children. We also brought a snack for after the event: champurrado atole with sweet bread.
  2. We received support from Milca's brother and his family to carry out the Christmas program. They are always available to participate (since some members of our church have left the city, and other brothers who support us are recovering from surgery), so as a token of our gratitude, we brought them a gift this year.
  3. On one occasion, we went to a hospital in the city and brought coffee, sweet bread, and some Bible tracts. The people were very receptive to the message.
  4. On December 25th, we went to a rehabilitation center near the church. We brought sweet bread for the residents, introduced ourselves, and although they are not Christians, they welcomed us warmly.
  5. We are evangelizing weekly at a sports complex near the church. Every Wednesday, we hold a service and offer bread and coffee. The problem we've encountered is the faulty electrical installation, as we can't use it (it previously damaged one of our speakers). We recommend purchasing a rechargeable speaker so we can continue preaching.
  6. We were also able to bless some brothers and sisters who will be going on a mission trip to the Huasteca Potosina region (San Luis Potosí) this week, using the remaining candy and gifts from the event. They were praying because they hadn't collected anything for the children, and God led me to them. I know it will bless many children.
  7. Finally, we will use the rest of the offering to buy paint and donate a can to the place where we are allowed to preach (the sports complex near the church) and also to paint the church facilities.
- That's all for now. Warm regards from the local church, and we thank you again for your prayers, financial support, and love, which we can feel even from a distance. We pray that God will bless your lives and wish you a Happy New Year 2026.

## FWCC 2026 Letter to Meetings

Dear Friends

When Jesus' birth was announced it was with news of peace.

Jesus began his ministry by talking about peace, and said goodbye to his disciples by leaving them with peace.

The first word of the risen Christ was peace. Paul began many of his letters by speaking of peace.

And yet, the world does not reflect peace. Even as many of us were reading and singing of peace on earth this year, warlike acts were being planned. But Jesus does not give as the world gives. Instead he advises "do not be afraid".

Our work for peace on earth and our experience of Christ's peace are not separate. And yet finding peace in ourselves joined to peace in the world is the vocation of a lifetime. It wasn't easy in Jesus' time and it isn't easy in ours.

As a step on this journey, the CEC has agreed the next World Plenary Meeting will be themed 'Blessed are the Peacemakers', with a target date of 2030, to mark 2000 years since the start of Jesus' Ministry. We are looking for invitations to host.\*

In preparation we are planning quarterly global meetings for worship online (subscribe to Friends World News for updates) and a big online gathering for World Quaker Day (4 October 2026).

Another date for your diary is 29 September 2027 when we plan a global online conference to share our efforts in addressing historic and continuing injustice. Some queries will follow soon.\*\*

Within Friends World Committee for Consultation please join me in gratitude for Esther Mombo who has completed her year as Interim Clerk, and will now begin as Vice Chancellor of St Paul's University in Kenya, while continuing as Assistant Clerk.

We also feel grateful for Simon Lamb who served previously, especially around the anniversary of his passing this first month of the year.

Please also join me in welcoming our new clerk, Clare Scott-Booth. She was an elder at our most recent World Plenary Meeting, and brings with her immense experience from her career in leading charities that provide housing for people in need.

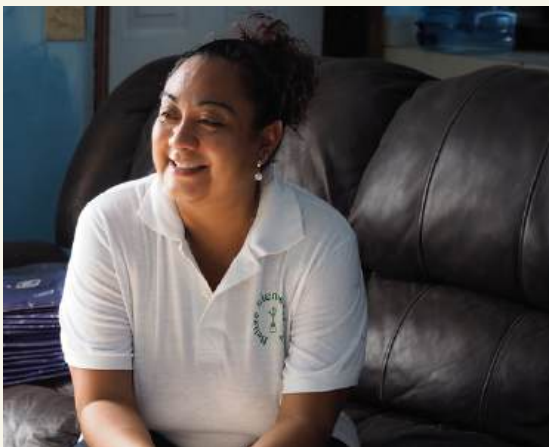
