
Welcome to your Friends Church North Carolina Newsletter!

A Word of Devotion:

"THAT GOOD, Terrible day"

"For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God."

Hebrews 12:2

Good Friday. The terror and the intimacy of that blood-stained cross. Despair and hope shaken together in the defining moment of all time. Love and hate colliding. Joy and victory emerging amidst the suffering.

It is fitting to think again about suffering during the season we are in—Lent and Easter. It is also fitting for the times in which we find ourselves: fallen leaders, failed peace agreements, and tragic events and circumstances all around us. And the uncertainty of the cracking twenty-first-century landscape around us.

I don't pretend to be able to truly relate to intense suffering, at least not at this point in my life. Even as I write that, I realize that this is likely to change at some point. Not because I'm pessimistic, or because I doubt God's grace, favor, and protection over me and my family, but because I have come to realize that both joy and suffering have been packaged into this gift that we all hold—life on

The psalmist gives us a beautiful picture of the spiritual secret that many of us have discovered—that there is a table to feast from in the midst of the valley, prepared specially by our Father. He sets it before us and invites us to eat, in faith, despite everything

earth.

crumbling or crashing around us:

Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; ... You prepare a table for me in the presence of my enemies. Psalms 23:4-5

Last year I spent some time rediscovering the Beatitudes:

"Blessed are the poor in spirit. ... Blessed are those who mourn." Matthew 5:3-4

Blessed means spiritually joyful, divinely favored, deeply satisfied. What is our Lord trying to teach us with this sort of seemingly incongruous statement? In our youth, or as immature believers, we may feel that being blessed mostly looks like happiness and vacations and bonuses and miracles. Yet we call this special day "Good Friday."

It is the day we remember intense suffering and mourning—and yet it is also the day we remember His freedom-winning sacrifice and love for us. An intensely good day, a blessed day in the deepest sense of the word.

Peace in the midst of pain. Joy despite suffering. The choicest food in the darkest valley.

May you experience this Easter weekend as one in which you are able to truly feast at His table—illuminated by His gift of joy in the midst of whatever else is going on around and within you.





Hope Carter has served as a missionary in Africa along with her husband, Bob Carter, for 38 years. They began their service as FUM Missionaries and in later years worked with SIM to continue their work in Africa. Over the years, they have worked with AIDs education, provided support for orphans, worked with TB and Leprosy services at Mukinge Hospital and mentored new pastors and leaders through promotion of the Jesus film.

For the past 11 years, they have lived in Kijabe, Kenya and divided their time between Kijabe Hospital and Moffat Bible College. Hope assisted the hospital with its HIV clinic for 2 years and then focused fulltime on teaching in AIDS Ministries at Moffat along with being the health coordinator. At the end of their 38 years of service, they will return to The United States after attending the FUM Triennial in July. They will return periodically to Africa for shorter periods of time while working remotely and helping the home office.

Please join us to hear Bob and Hope's story and all that has happened over the years in Africa. Their challenges and triumphs in Africa correlate with our theme of "Abounding in Hope" by the leading of the Holy Spirit.

Ground is being prepared before planting at FUM's Ambwere Farm sustainability project near Kitale, Kenya

- In late September, the Ambwere family, a Quaker family in Kenya offered to lease their 900 acre farm to FUM, an area well suited for growing corn. Several FUM staff and board visited the farm and sought advice from other farmers and met with an attorney. The FUM Executive Board approved proceeding.
- A Farm Management Committee was appointed which included several Quakers in the Kitale area with expertise in large scale agriculture. They hired a farm manager and put a plan in place to improve productivity. The land had been producing sugar cane for the last 6 years. A mill in the area has offered to purchase all the corn produced this year. Soil preparation and plowing has started and planting will begin in March with expected harvest in October.
- Giving from North American Friends is decreasing, but the ministry needs are not. The FUM General Board created the Sustainability Committee to develop business and investment projects to supplement FUM programs. This committee consists of four members from North America, four from Kenya and one from Jamaica. If successful, once all loans are repaid and operational costs accounted, this farming project is projected to net \$100,000.
- The war in Ukraine is limiting the supply of grain to Africa and food inflation is causing alarming food
 insecurity in Africa. By raising corn we will be able to feed hungry people.
- The first year of farming is being financed through loans. The budgeted projection is \$600,000 to lease the land, put in the crop and harvest it. FUM has secured a loan for \$450,000. FUM is willing to pay 6% interest on the loan. FUM anticipates they will begin repaying the loans after the second harvest and plan to repay the loans in full by the fifth year. To simplify bookkeeping, we request the minimum loan amount be \$5,000. The money should be sent to the FUM office in Richmond and designated as a loan for the Sustainability Project.
- Any donation will offset operational costs. Contact Lloyd Stangeland (lloyd.stangeland@gmail.com) to learn about making a loan.
- Please pray for the Ambwere Farm Project. A group of Kenyan Friends gathered on the farm to bless the land and the bountiful harvest that will grow there. There has been rain and planting started March 17.
 The plan is to complete planting by the end of the month when the forecast is for more rain
