
Welcome to your new Friends Church North Carolina Newsletter! This is a monthly e-newsletter dedicated to keeping you up to date on current events within FCNC.

Welcome Home to Allen And Juanita Bullard



In February 2021, a need to help a fellow Friends pastor came to our attention. We learned that Allen and Juanita Bullard could use some help. Allen and Juanita were living in a travel trailer/RV on property belonging to their daughter, Angela. The RV was connected to a septic system for the old home place that used to belong to Juanita's parents. The RV was not meant to live in full time and was bought 3 years ago when Allen and Juanita had to move out of the parsonage at Liberty Friends. It was not suitable for them much longer. They had minimal income at the time and paying for the RV was taking most of their funds. We approached helping the Bullard family in a few ways...

- 1. Friends Disaster Service was not able to help because of the special nature of their "disaster" support. Several volunteers were ready to help, but the property for potential renovation was not a candidate.
- 2. We investigated any funds that FCNC or NCYM might have that could be used to help Allen and Juanita. There were no trust or accounts setup for this specific purpose.
- 3. We made the requests to local meetings served by the Allen and Juanita; Concord, Edward Hill, Liberty, Science Hill and now closed Spring Garden.
- 4. We made a general plea for help to FCNC, as people touched by their ministry were scattered and serving in a lot of areas.
- 5. We asked for prayer for this request. We prayed for God to do the work in hearts before the requests were made so that these two servants of God could get the help they needed and deserved.

The result was an outpouring of love and support. Individuals, meetings, quarters and FCNC all sent money to Allen and Juanita. One couple heard the need, and had a small rental home and offered it to Allen and Juanita. Allen and Juanita met with the couple, discussed the property and moved in to the rental home over the next 8 weeks or so. Allen and Juanita are so appreciative of the ministry of friends and Friends and the outpouring of love and support to them during their time of need. God is so good!





Candle Light at Quaker Lake
